WE EAT BUTTER, Its Constituents.

What is true butter made of? Well. it contains Butyrie, Caproic, Capryic. Capric, Myristle, Palmetic, Stearic, and Oleic acids, these being in combination with a glycerin radcal, in the form of Olein, Stearin, Palmitin, etc. Then it contains Casein.
