It was the hardest fought bottle yet; I will never forget it or what followed. I was hit at 3:30 and had to lie till after dark before I dare try to leave. It was the hottest corner in the field, right at the bend of the river. Craig and I went up to bring off a wounded man; the Boers bad a bead on the spot and they soon bowled me over. I rolled behind a raise where Craig had got to. There were enough of shells and bullets going over us to put a whole army out of action if each one found a mark, bullets cutting up the sand all around me and cutting limbs and twigs off the trees. Oh, it was a day to remember. I was not more than 300 yards from the Boer trenches. How much I could write if I had the use of my right hand, but this is hard work. My right arm is in the way and I can't hold the paper so you will have to make the best of it. A lot of our fellows went back to the front today; don't I envy them. Give my love to everyone. I hope the chocolate boxes have arrived.




