HAIL ANTHROPOLOGY!

What it May Build on Facts About Finger Nails.

The detection of criminals will, it

is believed, be much facilitated through the recent discovery of certain curious facts in regard to finger nails. When a crime is committed it is importent to learn whether the perpetrator is right handed or left handed, and an examination of the finger nails will throw abundant light on this point. Dr. Regnault, in a paper read before the Anthropological Society of Paris, shows that there is a wide difference between the nails of the right and those of the left hand, and that the nails of the right hand of a righthanded person are broader than those of the left hand, while the opposite is the case with left-handed persons. Dr. A. Minskow has made further researches in the same direction. According to him, the difference in the size of the nails of the right and left hand varies from one-fourth to two millimetres. In those rare instances in which both hands are used equally no difference in size 's noticeable. The thumbnail is always the broadest in the case of adults, and the middle finger has always the longest nail, next to it in order being the ring finger, the index finger and the little finger. The nails of the right hand are usually quite flat in the case of right-handed persons, the index finger and thumb being most marked in this Although the children must be pro- respect. 
