

Live Stock Market.

Toronto. At the western cattle market to-day the recerpts totalled only 35 carloads, comprising 1,500 hogs, 900 sheep and lambs, 400 cattle, and a light supply of mileh cows and calves.

We had a little more enquiry and some business doing in export cattle. but both for shipping and butcher cattle prices were not quotably changed.

Three or four loads of export cattle sold at from \$4.121 to \$4.50 per cwt and a few picked lots sold at 10c and 15e higher. There was no change in butcher cattle; for choice stuff prices were steady, but no improvement can fairly be reported in er cattle. The range for the best cattle was from 81 to 41e per lb and from

an le to a le more for selections. There was only a light trade in stockers. with prices rather more easy. Freders and feeding bulls were selling fairly well The few milch cows that came in were

sold at from \$25 to \$45 each. Good cows are in demand. Sheep and lambs all sold at quotably unchanged figures, but with a weaker

tendency, \$3.25 to \$3.50. Hogs are unchanged but firm.

Prime hogs are selling at 61c per lb. Sows are worth 31c per lb, and stags 20 For fat and light hogs the outside price was 51c per lb.
