Winnipeg Report--The Western Grain Standards Board concluded their deliberations yesterday on the advisability of reducing the number of grades of Manitoba spring wheat.

That it is the opinion of this Board that the methods of handling Manitoba wheat would be best served by making the following changes in the schedule of grades, viz.: That the grades of No. 2 hard and No. 1 northern be merged into one grade, the name of No. 1 northern, having the present qualifications of No. 1 northern with no less than 60 per cent. of hard wheat.
