Named M'Calman.

Mr. Alexander Carmichael gave the Glasgow Ruskin Society the other evening the result of his investigations into the family name of Ruskin, says the Westminster Gazette. In Glen Lonan, in the Land of Lorne, almost under the shadow of Ben Cruachan, there were at one time several industries carried on, among which was a tannery. To this tannery bark, of course, had to brought for dyeing purposes. One family of the district, by name Mc-Calman, seem to have applied them-selves to the peeling of the bark and bringing it to the tannery. Now, the bark of a tree is called in Gaelic "rusk," sounded "rooshk," and the men who followed this occupation were called "rushkers," and this cognomen stuck to the McCalman family.

This branch of the McCalman family is the one from which Ruskin was descended. One member of it migrated to Perthshire and took his cognomen with him. There we know independently that Ruskin's father was afterward born, and the later history is public property.
