**TOWN COUNCIL.**

Regular Meeting was held on Monday night, Mayor in the chair, Council all present. This last session should be modified by saying that the seat to which Wm. Sharp was elected is still vacant. He has claimed it on two occasions, but the mayor guided by the statutes, claims that the declaration or qualification is not adequate and consequently Mr. Sharp is not entitled to deliberate at the council board. We are not posted sufficiently in the law to pronounce upon the claim or the objection, both we presume have studied the statutes on the matter, and we think it most unwise that a divergence of opinion, with its consequences should longer exist. We hope a solution will be found for the difficulty, without further unpleasant features.

There never was a brighter prospect for fruit growers than this year, and nothing should be left undone to reap the full benefit. The man who has scabby apples left in his orchard next fall will have himself to blame. Some people have the impression that a sprayer is too expensive for the simple operation of spraying trees, but up-to-date farmers are using them for spraying cattle and preventing the horn-fly nuisance.—Ex.

**STANDARD MEASURES.**—By all means let us have honest boxes for berries and honest baskets for larger fruit. The packages in which fruit is sold are of all sizes, and whether or not they are made in irregular shapes and sizes for the express purpose of deceiving buyers, the fact is that they are deceptive and cause a great deal of dissatisfaction. Almost all other commodities are sold by the pound or quart. They is no reason why berries and fruit should be excepted. Not only should they be sold by the pint or quart, the same as other articles, but steps should be taken to prevent fraud by the covering up of inferior stuff with selected fruit on top of the basket or box. The Government should do all it can to enforce the principal of honesty in transactions between buyer and seller. The law should step in and protect the consumer in every legitimate way, and one such way is the use of standard measures in the sale of these articles.
