Rev. Dr. Talmage Says There Are Too Many People Disposed to Tell All They Know

A Washington report: A practical question which is asked in most houses, and for many years, is here asked by Dr. Talmage and answered.

INTERNATIONAL LESSON NO. VII. AUG. 18, 1901.

Abraham's Intercourse.—Gen. 18:1-15. Commentary.—Connecting Links.—In B. C. 2200, about six-hundred years before the birth of our Lord Jesus, the Lord again appeared to Adam and renewed the covenant with him.

What would you rather have in your hands when you come to die, a pack of cards or a Bible? Which would you rather have pressed to your lips in the closing moment, the cup of Balaam's curse or the chalice of Christian communion?

Who would you rather have for your preachers, the elders of a Christian church or the companions whose conversation was full of slang and innuendo?

Who would you rather have for your eternal companions, those men who spend their evenings betting, gambling, swearing, carousing and telling vile stories, or your little cat that bright girl whom the Lord took? You can never break away from the little arms that used to be flung around your neck when she used to say, "Papa, do stay with me to-night; do stay with me to-night; do stay with me to-night."

28. The safe shall be lock.—The safety of the city being granted on the condition that fifty righteous could be found, Abraham takes courage and asks still larger things. He drops to forty-five, then to forty, then to thirty, then to twenty, and finally to ten.

29. But this once.—Abraham's intercession was limited because the intercessor was not a man; it did not reach the need. He said, "I will not yet but this once, and then he stopped short, as if afraid of having presented too large a draft at the treasury of infinite grace, or forgetting that faith's check was not dishonored at God's bank."

30. The Lord went His way.—The angel-Jehovah—with whom Abraham had been communing, went his way. Abraham's prayer was answered, though not in the way he expected.

In chapter 19 we have an account of the destruction of Sodom and the cities of the plain. The two angels that left Abraham went to Sodom (xix. 1) where they were received kindly by Lot, but shamefully used by the people of Sodom. The angels told Lot to warn his friends to flee, for they had been sent to destroy the city.

The lesson embraces the first prayer the Bible records, in which, with its context, we find the following practical truths. The promise renewed. Long before God had promised the children of patriarchs that his seed should be as the stars of heaven.

RULER'S LIVES IN DANGER

Anarchists of Europe in Widespread Conspiracy. KING OF GREECE IS MENACED.

Chicago report: Writing to the Record-Herald from Aix-les-Bains, Margaret E. W. Sherwood says: You ask me for details of the recent attempted assassination of Dowager Queen Maria Pia of Portugal.

On the night of Aug. 4th the unknown mysterious crime followed the King's Majesty. Having taken part in the baptism of her niece, Princess Yolande, the infant daughter of the King of Italy, Maria Pia, accompanied by her suite, left the church.

Just what happened has not reached the public, but it is said that the insane priest tried to stab the Queen with a poniard. Her escape is attributed to the waiting and her chamberlain, who threw himself between her Majesty and the assassin and seized his arm.

Although the police are making every endeavor to flush the matter out, it is asserted that the assassin has been arrested and that a keen hunt is being made after his accomplices.

Queen Maria Pia, pale and agitated, after the attempt on her life, left Rome, stopping on her way at Turin, where she visited the home of her sister, Princess Clotilde. Her Majesty enjoined the police to refrain from making wholesale arrests, in the thought that the extreme reticence of the authorities is due to the efforts they are making to discover a widespread and dangerous conspiracy, of which the attempted murder of Queen Maria's life was only a part.

It is also said that the plot involves the assassination of King George of Greece. Beyond question the whole of Europe is honeycombed with anarchistic plots, and Kings and Queens are not sleeping on beds of roses.

Rome, Aug. 8.—Luigi Gianotti, an Anarchist, was charged at Milan to-day with being one of the conspirators in the murder of the King of King Humbert. Gianotti, it is asserted, can be proved to have accompanied Bresci from the United States to Monza and there contributed to the murder of the King by provoking a scuffle before the royal carriage and thus diverting the attention of the police from Bresci's movements. Gianotti, after the assassination, seemed to write "and, but was extradited. It is expected that he will make important revelations.
