Ottawa Report.—On Saturday, Nov. 23rd, was shipped from Ottawa the first lot of stockers ever sent to British Columbia. The shipment consisted of some four hundred head of calves and yearlings, of excellent quality.

Mr. Hawden, the Secretary of the British Columbia Dairyman's and Live Stock Breeding Association, who went west to look after this shipment, was well pleased with the stock. He says that so long as stockers of similar quality can be secured in the east at a reasonable price, this trade will increase year by year.

In addition to the above mentioned shipment, a further lot of 1,000 stockers is now ordered and will be shipped at reasonable prices.
