It would appear that compresses of alcohol may be used in the treatment of appendicitis. At any rate, M. Filatoff so asserts. This surgeon, in fact, considers that it suffices to keep the finger in a small glass of brandy for half an hour, and repeat the bath several times a day to put a stop to the pathological processes on the point of breaking out.

I knew another from appendicitis, in which he was sent for in consultation. Here is his method of procedure: A compress of gauze folded in four, and wide enough to cover the entire stomach, is thoroughly steeped in alcohol at 93 degrees, slightly squeezed, applied directly on the skin and covered with flannel. Over all is placed an ice bag, and the compress is changed every hour, as soon as the alcohol has evaporated. Opium is administered at the same time.
