THE ONTARIO PROVINCIAL AUCTION SALE.

The Provincial Auction Sales which were held at Guelph and Ottawa last year in February and March more than realized the expectations of all interested. The sales this year will take place during the month of February. A change, however, has been made in the order of the Sales. That at Ottawa will take place first February 12th, and the Guelph one, February 26th.

As only limited numbers of animals will be sold at each place, and as entries have been received for considerably more than the number required, an opportunity will be given to select only the very best. Animals will be selected that are in the pink of condition, and good individuals of the breed they represent. No unworthy animals will be accepted.

Persons wishing to purchase can depend upon being able to choose from a lot of stock of individual merit and good breeding. The names of a large number of prominent breeders is a guarantee of the quality of the stock offered.

BREEDS REPRESENTED.

The animals to be sold at Ottawa include Shorthorns, Ayrshires, Yorkshires, and Tamworths. At Guelph there will be only representatives of the Beef Breeds and swine. Naturally Shorthorns predominate in numbers and of these, there are a great many excellent representatives. Such breeders as Hon. Jno. Dryden, T. E. Robinson, Ilfordon, A. W. Smith, Maple Lodge, R. Gibson, De'are, A. Johnston, Greenwood, J. T. Gibson, Denfield, R. S. Nicholson, Sylvan, W. G. Sanders, St. Thomas, A. & W. Whitlaw, Guelph, W. Smith, Columbus, E. Jeffs & Son, Bond Head, Jno. Bright, Myrtle, H. K. Fairbairn, Thedford, W. G. Ormiston, Columbus, F. G. Sibbald, Sutton West, A. Moore, Greenwood, J. E. Meyer, Koskoff and fully seventy five other breeders of Shorthorns, have stock entered. Among other breeds, J. G. Clark, Ottawa, and Hon. W. Owings Montebello have entered Ayrshires; D. McCrae, Guelph, Galloways and swine; R. Reid & Co. Tamworths, Berkshires, Ayrshires; Jno. A. Richardson, South March, Holsteins.

It will thus be seen that there will be not only a large number of animals to be disposed of but that they will be all good representatives of the breeds, as every precaution will be taken to secure this end. Buyers can attend the sales, with every confidence that they can there purchase what they require, and they can look over the stock in the Building before the sales begin, and at any time until its close.

Reduced rates will be granted to parties who attend these Sales, over the C. P. R. from local stations East of Fort Williams and from all points on the Northern and North Western Division of the G. T. R., L. E. & D. R. R., Eri and Huron Ry., Central Ontario Ry., Kingston & Pembroke Ry., Bay of Quinte Ry., & Navigation Co., H. C. R. in Canada, C. A. Ry., and the Ottawa and N. Y. Ry.

Those attending the Sales must purchase first-class full-rate, one way tickets to Ottawa or Guelph, and obtain certificates to that effect on standard certificate form. Ticket agents are supplied with standard certificates, and are instructed to issue them on application. Where persons have to travel over more than one railway to reach the place of sale they will require to purchase tickets and obtain certificates as above from each railway, except stations on lines mentioned above.

Buyers of car lots coming from West of Port Arthur, will be given the same rate as is allowed on settlers effects. One free pass will be allowed with each car of pure bred stock. All purchasers who buy a carload for use in Canada, and who have paid full passenger fare from a starting point in Canada to either of the sales, will be refunded one half their first class fare, or if such purchaser has travelled second class, a reduction will be made to one cent per mile. A claim for the refund must be accompanied by a receipt for the fare paid and also the freight bill covering the shipment of live stock.

These arrangements have been completed with the C. P. R. and G. T. R. F. W. Hodson, Live Stock Commissioner.

We had another rather light run at the Western cattle market today, the total receipts amounted to 53 cars, including 934 cattle, 500 sheep and lambs, 1,100 hogs, two dozen calves, and a dozen milk cows.

The market was a repetition of the market yesterday; prices for all good grades, both in cattle and small stuff, being strongly maintained.

Good choice export cattle sold quickly at from 4½ to 5½ per lb., an eighth more was paid for some choice lots, and 5½ was touched.

Butcher cattle was quoted unchanged, and choice stuff was strong at \$4 to \$5.

There is no change in sheep and lambs; good lambs are wanted at \$3.75 to \$4.00.

There is an active demand for good veal calves. Quoted from \$2 to \$10.

Hogs are weak at the decline yesterday.

Choice hogs to-day sold at \$6 per cwt;

light hogs and fat hogs at \$5.75 per cwt.
