Live Stock Market Toronto.

Trade was very brisk at the Toronto Cattle Market this morning and the prices were in most cases well up to those of vesterday. The grass cattle are beginning to come forward now and are bringing good prices at present. The offerings to-day were 61 loads, which included 700 cattle, 740 sheep and lambs, 1,982 hogs and loo calves. There were a lot of poor cattle among the receipts to-day and they were not in the best of demand. The result was that butchers' cattle fell off in price. For the choice offerings. however, there were good prices obtained and the sales were easy to make. The trade in sheep and lambs was only fair. The receipts were large and the prices fell off a little. Export sheep were off 25c per cwt and spring lambs sold at a deeline of from 25c to 5oc per cwt.


