"The costliest of all the smoked "are the fine hams and bacon that come from Limerick, Ireland. The prices of these meats may vary slightly from time to time, the hams selling usually, however, at from 33 to 35 cents a pound, and the bacon at 32 or 33 cents a pound.

"These costly smoked meats are made from fine hogs that are fed and tended with scrupulous care. The curing process, is a secret.

"The combined result is shown in meats of such quality and flavor as to commend them most highly. "Of course there are fine hams produced here, also, notably those of Virginia, the finest of which bring 24 of the Limerick hams and bacon is a duty of 5 cents a pound. If you were to add that to the price of the Virginia hams you would raise the cost of them to 20 cents, and adding further the cost of transportation from Europe, would bring the Virginia hams pretty close to those of Limnal cost they are about the same. "As to which is the better ham, that would be largely a matter of taste. The Irish ham is rich and fulcy, the Virginia is of a more delicate flavor."
