#### Ginger Apples. Pare and quarter as many apples

Now add the remainder of the sugar. Peel a lemon, boil the rind in a little water, about half a teacupful of water to one rind, and to every two pounds of fruit add this lemon water and the juice of a whole lemon, also one ounce of ginger to every two pounds of fruit. The ginger may be tied in a muslin bag if not desired put in with the fruit. Cook until the apples are transparent. This recipe makes delicious preserves, and will answer equally well for pears, vegetable marrow, squash and citron, the latter should be boiled in clear water first until tender. -Chicago Herald.


