Ac-73 5-8 cording to physicians a healthy Toledo 77 79 1-2 75 :-8 | baby may cut its first tooth before it is four months old, or it may be quite toothless at the age of eight or nine months.

Generally, however, at birth, a haby's gums are smooth, firm, and of a light pink color, the edges rather hard and sharp. After a few months the edges of the gums grow broader in front, as the teeth begin to reach the surface, and they become rather more prominent, but when teething is procosing in a normal way they do not become red and inflamed. The gams only remain in this condition for a month or so previous to the

eruption of the first tooth. The teeth should always make their appearance in a certain definite order, but this is very much subject to variation, so anxious mothers need not worry if the teeth do not always make their appearance in the order given in book. There are twenty temporary, or milk teeth, and their "cutting"
