The physiognomists have learned to read these muscles. Ordinary folk cannot go so deeply into the subject: they simply look to find the result of muscular development in the face. Through the varied and different workings of the two brain sections the facial muscles are developed or retarded in growth.

For example, the physical characteristics of the right hemisphere of the brain produce an effect on the right side of the face much more quickly than the workings of the left hemisphere. 
