

Wedding Bells are ringing. Live Stock Markets Toronto.

Trade at the Toronto Cattle Market continued slow to-day, especially in ex-Mr. Wm. J. Hav has engaged with port cattle. There will be cattle wanted next week, and dealers say prospects are for a better trade. Total run amounted to 36 cars, including 351 cattle, 280 sheep and lambs, 1,289 hogs and 34 calves.

Export Cattle-The run offering was very light, there being only two loads on the market. The demand showed no improvement, but the light run gave a slightly firmer feeling to prices. There 13 prospect of more shipping space offering in the near future, and dealers say that some good cattle will be wanted next week. A. bout \$4.35 to \$4.50 was paid for the few good exporters offering, and in one case \$4.65 was paid for extra picked stock.

Butchers' Cattle-Pienty of common stuff was offering, and was sold at prices well within quotations. The best of the offerings brought \$4.25 to \$4.35 but better prices would have been paid for better stuff. Common to medium sold at about \$2.70 \$0 \$3.50.

Milch Cows-Extra good milch cows continue scarce and in demand. There was a light run of other kinds on the market, and not many were wanted. Steady at \$35 to \$60 each.
