

INTERNATIONAL LESSON NO. VII. MAY 17, 1903.

Paul Before Felix. -- Acts 24: 10-16, 24-26.

Commentary.-I. The charges against Paul (vs. 1-9) Within five days the high priest, Ananias, together with representatives from the Sanhedrin, accompanied by a professional orator, Tertulius, arrived in Caesarea to present their charges against Paul. Tertullus began by flattering Felix, as one who had done great and noble deeds, and who had greatly advanced the government. This was not in keeping with the truth for "both Josephus and Tacitus represent him as one of the most corrupt and oppresive rulers ever sent by the Romans into Judea."

II. Paul's defence (vs. 10-21). 10. Paul--answered-Although twice before Paul had spoken what he called a defence-first, before a vast crowd of Jews in the temple area, and again before the assembled Sanhedrin-yet this is his first actual defence, as he now stands before an imperial tribunal, the governor representing the person and authority of the emperor.-Butler. Forasmuch as I know-It is remarkable that Paul did not begin his speech, as Tertullus had done, by any flattering address, or by any of the arts of rhetoric.
