St. Petersburg, May 18.-Additional details of the Kisheneff massacre of a telegram from the British Consul Montreal, and that four of them, Jews are printed here daily. The correspondents give the number of victims thus far buried in the Jewish cemetery as 44, and say that 34 persons seriously wounded are still in the Jewish Hospital. The horrors reported scarcely bear repetition. In one instance spikes were driven through a woman's head into the floor, and cases of boy mutilation have been authenticated. About 800 to 1,000 persons were arrested, an official having been sent from Odessa to deal with the situation. The apathy of the local authorities during two days of rapine and murder has been fully established.
