THE LATE MRS. PECKOVER.

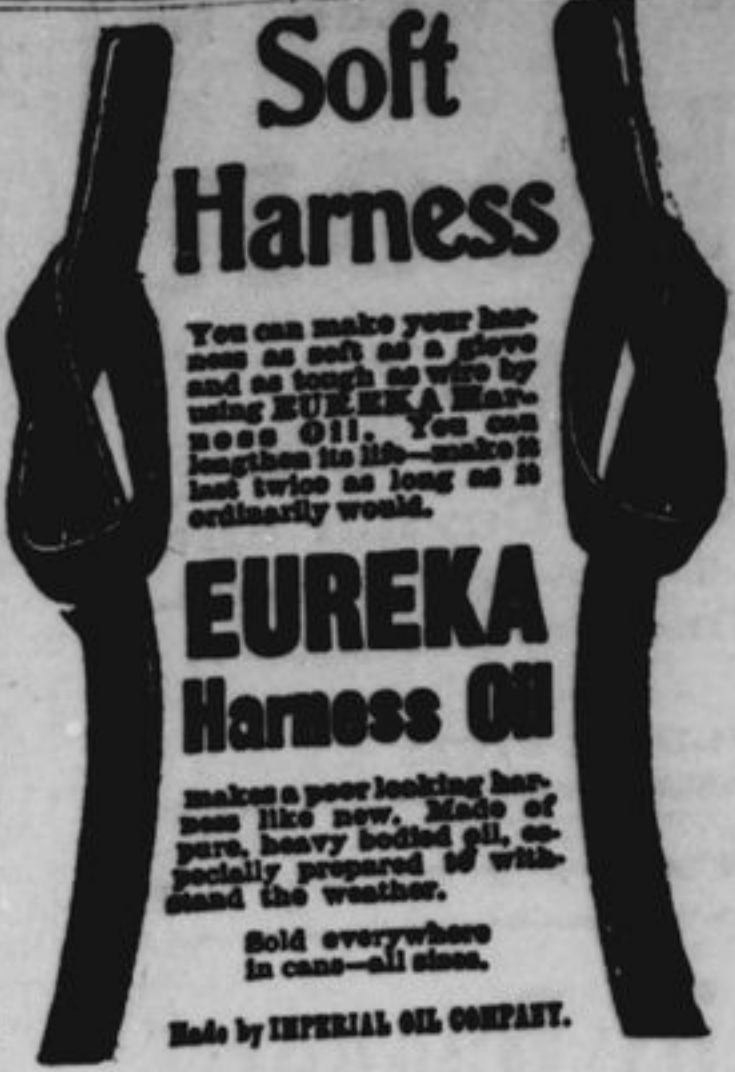
[The following obituary of a well-known Egremont lady was sent us last week, and her death will call forth deep regrets.—Ed.]
