EGREMONT COUNCIL

Council met July 8. Minutes approved.
Com. McFadden reported grading on
Varney sideroad by Chas. Gray \$20; W
Lawrence, cutting hill, lot 4, con. 22, \$7.

Robb—Gordon—That report be adopted
and Com be paid \$2.50 fees. Carried.

Com. Gordon reported grading along G.
A. bare line by Jim Walker, 45 rds \$32.20
grading same place 5 ft wide, 8 in deep
by Tom Peacock. \$25.30.

McQueen—Robb—That report be adopted
and Com receive \$5 com. fees. Carried.

Gordon—McFadden—That Com. Robb
be authorized to sell the old bridge timber
at McQueen's. Carried.

McQueen, Gordon and Robb reported
on bridges. Found south end of Binney's
bridge moved 10 inches to the north, and
piles at said end moved 4 inches under
the bridge by reason of heavy pressure of
bank against said end, resulting in shortening
spans 14 in. The upper structure is
all right and recommends immediate action
to secure the abutments. Found
Drewry's bridge unsafe for travel, timber
much decayed by reason of age, and re-
commended that said bridge be replaced
by a new one immediately on account of
the heavy traffic on said road.

McFadden—McFadden—That the report be
adopted and that same Com be appointed
to operate at once and have Russell's
bridge put in a safe condition. Carried.

Robb—McFadden—That the Clerk be in-
structed to ask for tenders for a new bridge
at Drewry's, contractor to find his own
plans and specifications, timber to be good
sound tamarack, rock elm or pine, ten-
der to be opened at next meeting of Council.
Carried.

Com. Gordon reported securing Wright's
lot, Lot 2 Con 5-6, grading and clearing
road 6 feet, raising 200 feet by C. B. Evans
cost \$50. Win Maplett making bridge
and piling supports under stringers, lot 7
con. 5-6, cost \$22; rep. Maplett's bridge,
Con 5-6 by W. McFadden work \$7.25, do 21
ft. stringers 75 cts. Maplett and Mc-
Gruiter's cedar covering \$1.50 Total \$9.50.

McFadden—Robb—That report be ad-
opted and Com receive \$3 fees. Carried.

Com. McFadden reported spending 14
days trying Pademaster's grader but
found state labor nearly all done.

Robb—McQueen—That Com. McFa-
den's report be adopted and he be paid \$3
com. fees. Carried.

Coms. McQueen and Gordon as a Com-
mittee reported that under the Ditch-
and Watercourse Act they had settled the
difficulty by buying the tiles. Mr. Sizer to
put them in; cost of the \$1.25. The other
place they considered they were not
interested in.

Robb—McFadden—That report be ad-
opted and Com receive \$5 each com. fees.
Carried.

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
