FROM OLD ENGLAND. Mrs. Cameron Describes Interesting Incidents on the Trip. Leicester, Aug 3, 1903. Dear Mr. Ramage

You will excuse me if this letter is somewhat belated. My time has been so fully occupied among numerous relatives at Nottingham, Newark and Leicester, and my uncle's desire so strong that I should see every place of interest, particularly those which were of old associated with my childhood's years, that letter writing was out of the question.

My first letter was written hurriedly and not worth publication. I had intended posting you another on reaching Liverpool, but the last day on board, Saturday, was one of such excitement viewing land once more, that we were on deck constantly looking at the brilliantly green hills of the Emerald Isle.

On Sabbath morning after breakfast we bade good bye to our fellow passengers with some of whom we had got quite friendly. Among these were Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Evans from Centerville, South Dakota, and Mr. Evans' uncle, Mr. Spittel, who came up to me saying he had been told I was from Durham.

We decided to remain in Liverpool over the Sabbath day, and accompanied by a Mr. Logan and his daughter of London, Ont., took rooms at the "Stork Hotel." In the afternoon we mounted to the top of a tram and went up to Dr. Watson's Church to find out if he was to preach in the evening, for we could not ascertain that without doing so.

On Monday morning we had to see the Shipping Company, and as their office is not opened till 9 a. m., we could not leave Liverpool till about 11 o'clock. My next letter will take in our visit to Nottingham, Leicester and Newark.

P. S.—We have been talking this morning with Mr. Moffatt and his brother of Weston, Ont., Stove Manufacturers. They have not been able to get a passage back on the Allan Line though they took a return ticket, but have to go by New York on "Campania," a Cunarder. They leave tomorrow.
