**PRICEVILLE.**

This week we feel it our duty to report on no less than five funerals since last time of writing. Three took place in the cemetery in this village and the other two in neighboring communities. As was seen in a former issue of the Review of the death of M K Beaton, a prominent resident of the township of Glenelg in former years, being one of its officials for several years, who died at Trout Lake two weeks ago, from the effects of gangrene. The body was taken to friends at Fiesherston and was buried in Priceville with masonic honors, he being a member of that body. Mr Beaton was a member of some beneficiary societies for which his widow will receive the amount of his insurance. M K was well and favorably known throughout the County of Grey, he being in the timber business for a number of years. He leaves a wife and one child and an aged mother, sisters and one brother to mourn his death.

On Oct 28th Mrs Arch Muir died at the age of 70 years, a long resident of the township of Artemesia, coming there some fifty years ago. She like many of the pioneers of the forest knew what it was to settle in a new country and had to endure the trials of leaving one's home in the woods. She was a quiet and inoffensive woman and was a good member of the Presbyterian church. Her husband died about thirty years ago. Ley Mr Matheson officiated at the house and grave.

Many will remember the late Duncan McMillan, of Swinton Park, as being a man that the words of the psalmist are applicable in marking "the perfect man and beholding the upright." As we only make mention by way of extending our sympathy to the bereaved ones, shall not say much as an account of his death has appeared already.

The man that has passed the highest mark allotted, must die, while the young man in the bloom of youth is looking forward to old age as a thing far away into the future, consequently he views death from a natural standpoint as a thing that is far away from him, but alas the messenger comes often to the young man and claims him to be his. A few days ago George Court, a young man of about 27 years died at his father's home, South Line, Glenelg, after an illness of several months from the effects of a cold contracted. He was buried at Ebenezer cemetery on Friday last, Rev Mr Bosch officiating.

Now we come to the last which was a sad one, the death of Mary M-Cormack, beloved wife of John McLachlin, who died on the 5th inst., after an illness of some ten days, caused by an operation for obstruction of the intestines. Mrs McLachlin was about 70 years of age. A strong, healthy woman, until seized with the trouble that caused her death. She, with her husband braved life's battles for forty five years and by her good management in assisting her husband in carrying on the duties of life and raising a large family they accumulated plenty of the world's goods to make themselves and family in comfortable circumstances. She was the mother of eight living sons and three daughters, and now that she is gone, when those sons and daughters, some far away from the old home, visit the home of their youth, they will only find as did the one of our town, the garments which a beloved mother wore and it is no wonder that it is with tears dropping that they exclaimed "What is a home without a mother." Yes, it is sad to be left without a mother, but it is sadder for the father to be left in his declining years, tressed as a ship on the ocean of life in loneliness, for the wife, who shared his joys and troubles during her life has ceased to be, no more comfort to him in cheering him on the pathway the rest of his journey. On account of mortification setting in the funeral had to take place a day sooner than expected, consequently a large number of friends and others were not aware of the funeral so soon. Rev Mr Matheson officiated at the house and the grave. Mrs McLachlin, in religion was a Presbyterian.

Thus ends the life of a beloved wife and mother. Rev Mr Hunter, of Markdale, preaching in the Presbyterian church in this place on Sunday last. Rev Mr Matheson took Mr Hunter's place morning and evening.

Mr Walter Nichol, of Knox College, Toronto, son of Jno Nichol near here, will preach next Sunday at 11 o'clock in the morning. No doubt many will avail themselves of the opportunity of coming out to hear a fellow citizen, who was born and raised in the suburbs of our town.

Commissioner John McArthur spent last week on his duties attending County Council at Owen Sound.

The trustees engaged Miss Ross, of Mimico, daughter of Mr Ross, of 1-18 place, for the Junior department of our school for 1904.

The entertainment held here last week in aid of our library was fairly well attended, but not as well as might be on account of threshings and such like. The talent were good and the programme a splendid one, but the crowd was rather small, consequently the amount received was also small.

Professor Wm Ramage, of Dromore, has started a singing class in the basement of the Presbyterian church to be held every Saturday evening during winter. The fee is only nominal and every young man and woman should take advantage of the opportunity of attending as Mr Ramage is a first-class teacher and singer.
