EGREMONT COUNCIL.

Council met Nov. 16. Minutes approved.

McFadden—McIntyre—That the reeve and assessor be paid \$2 each for selecting jurors upon the certificate of the Clerk of the Peace. Carried.

Robb—Gordon—That the clerk be instructed to enter upon the Collector's Roll That Mrs Way be exempt from land tax. Carried.

Com'r McFadden gave a detailed statement of expenditures on Allan's hill as follows:—D Hamilton, 11 days with team \$4.50; Man, 1 day \$1.50; J. P. Patterson, 1 day with team \$3; Palmer Patterson, 4 days, \$6; Jas Allan, 4 days team and plow, 13.00; Jas Matthews, 4 days, 6.00; W Allan, 2 days team and returning scrapers, 7.00; S Chapman, 2 days team, 6.00; B Wood, 2 days team, 6.00; do 2 days labor 3.00; A. G. Allan, 4 days work, team and plow 35.00; W J McFadden, 2 days, 1.50; Com'r getting scrapers, men and teams, 2.00; do 4 days overhauling, 8.00; expenses 25 cts. Total \$80.75.

Gordon—Robb—That foregoing report be adopted. Carried.

Com'r McFadden also reported the following jobs:—H Tucker, graveling 203 rds, lot 10, con 18, co-t \$14.50; R Pettigrew, rep. bridge O. S. R. at 2 of E. con 1, Eg's share 1.50; Jas Matthews, covering 2 culverts with plank Vanney sideline 8.76; R McMeekin, filling hole, lot 1, con 22, 1.60.

McIntyre—Robb—That report be adopted, and \$3 com fees be paid. Carried.

Com'r Gordon reported as follows:—W J Greig, 4 supports David's bridge \$4; John Hunt, culvert con 2, and drawing the 400; do filling 2 holes, 2.00; C Schrieber, lengthening hole, Kirkness bridge, 1.25; also Com'r had 1.14 of old timber, Ferguson's bridge and paid into council 5.20, result of sale.

Robb—McIntyre—That said report be adopted and Com'r be paid \$2 com fees. Carried.

Robb—Gordon—That the claim of C Parrot of \$60.00 for damages, forwarded by his solicitors McKay and Dunn be settled by the payment of \$30 and order be granted for the same. Carried.

Robb—Gordon—That Com'r McQueen's report be adopted and that he receive \$2 com fees. Carried.

Gordon—Robb—That A H Zettel be paid 50 cts for the use of room for council held in July. Carried.
