THE WOMEN OF CONNEMARA.

Beautiful though They Lead a Life of Hardship.

The numerous islands which lie along the rugged coast of Connemara are probably quite unknown to the ordinary tourist. A writer in the 'Evening Post'...

The scene at such times is beautiful in the extreme, when the western sides of the cliffs gleam with crimson and orange from the sunset, which has turned the whole coast into a sea of molten fire.

Notwithstanding their coarse work and exposure, the majority of the island girls are, we are told, remarkably handsome.

Their eyes, like deep, blue pools under a heather mountain, would make even plain faces attractive, but when accompanied by teeth white as ivory, which gleam behind red, good-humored lips and a pair of sunburnt cheeks, the result is bewitching.

Early marriages are the rule on the island, and there are great displays sometimes at the wedding, but the ceremonies are never considered valid unless followed by an all-night dance.

THE SLEEPING SICKNESS.

Observations on Three Patients From Africa in Paris.

Thanks to the courtesy of Dr. Wurtz, I was privileged to be present at the operation on one of the three negroes from the Congo who are now undergoing treatment in Paris for the terrible affliction known as "sleeping sickness."

Makaya, the first negro examined in the clinic, was a native of the Hospital des Douces Fractions, a town of 25 years of age. His skin is of a dark chocolate color, but his lower limbs are of a curious pearly gray shade.

At the far end of the ward, in bed 19, was another negro from Accra, on the Gold Coast, in an advanced stage of sleeping sickness. When we entered he was as wide awake as his two comrades, but after a few minutes he relaxed into one of his torpid fits.

Between the two is a young negro, called Loubangui, about 12 or 13 years of age, who comes from a cannibal tribe on the west coast of Africa. He had developed a ganglion or tumor at the back of his neck, and by promise of chocolate he was prevailed upon to dress and come downstairs to the operating room, where the surgeons removed the ganglion.

Considerable difficulty was experienced in administering an anaesthetic, for one of the peculiar results of the sleeping sickness is that it neutralizes the effect of cocaine; and when the young negro had had injected more than double the amount of cocaine an ordinary patient would have required his flesh was still so sensitive that he writhed and kicked in the liveliest fashion, and three assistants had to hold down his arms and legs.

When I asked Dr. Wurtz what treatment he proposed for a cure, he told me he was using carbolic acid, on the principle recommended by Dr. Thompson in cases of plague. He is also using arsenic and hopes later to obtain a special serum, which added that he did not think the maldy was caused by a microbe, but rather by a trypanosome, belonging to the same group as the parasite which attacks cattle.

M. Emile Brant, who brought the negroes to Paris, told me that he had succeeded in inoculating a monkey with the sleeping sickness, and when after manifesting all the symptoms observed in the human victims it died. A quantity of parasites were discovered in the blood of the monkey, and with a view to obtaining serum of this nature, several experiments are being continued at the hospital on dogs, monkeys, guinea pigs, rabbits and other sleeping animals.
