BY-LAW NO. 457.
Of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham.

A By-law to Authorize the issue of Debentures of the Town of Durham in the County of Grey, to the amount of \$4000 for the purpose of paying off the indebtedness incurred in the building of a Bridge across the Sauguen River at Lambton Street in the Town of Durham and to repeal By-law No. 415 of the Corporation of the Town of Durham.

WHEREAS By-law No. 415 of the Corporation of the Town of Durham was enacted to provide for the issue of Debentures of the Town of Durham to the amount of \$2500.00 for the purpose of building a bridge across the Sauguen River at Lambton Street in the Town of Durham, and it has been found that the said sum of \$2500.00 is inadequate for the said purpose, and it is deemed advisable to repeal the said By-law No. 415.

AND WHEREAS the said bridge has been constructed and the cost of construction thereof is the sum of \$4000.00 or thereabout.

AND WHEREAS in order to pay off the indebtedness incurred in the construction of the said bridge it will be necessary to issue Debentures of the said Town of Durham, for the sum of \$4000.00 as hereinafter provided (which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this By-law) the proceeds of the said Debentures to be applied for the said purpose and no other.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said Debentures at one time and to make the principal of the said debt repayable by yearly sums, during the period of twenty years, being the currency of the said Debentures; said yearly sums being of such respective amounts, that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest, in respect of the said debt shall be, as nearly as possible, equal to the amount so payable in each of the other nineteen years of said period, as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed.

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be raised annually by special rate for interest on the said debt and interest as hereinafter provided is \$307.50.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Durham, according to the last assessment, roll thereof is \$622,036.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing Debenture debt of the said Municipality is \$3334.02 whereof no part of the principal or interest is in arrears.

THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham enacts as follows:—

(1) That By-law No. 415 of the Corporation of the Town of Durham, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

(2) That the sum of \$4000.00 shall be expended by the Town of Durham, in liquidation of the debt incurred in building a bridge across the Sauguen River, where the said River intersects Lambton Street in the Town of Durham, and for the purpose of raising the said sum, Debentures of the said Town to the amount of \$4000.00 as aforesaid in sums of not less than \$100.00 each, shall be issued on the 15th day of January A. D. 1904, each of which Debentures shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof and shall be payable within twenty years thereafter, (namely on the 6th day of January 1924) at the Standard Bank of Canada in the said Town of Durham.

(3) Each of the said Debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Town of Durham, and by the Treasurer thereof, and the Clerk of the said Town of Durham shall attach thereto the Corporate seal of the Municipality.

(4) The said Debentures shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per centum per annum, payable yearly at the said Bank, on the 6th day of January in each and every year during the currency thereof and shall be attached to them coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer of the said Town of Durham.

(5) During the currency of the said Debentures, there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said Town of Durham, the sum of \$307.50 for the purpose of paying the amount due in respect of the said Debentures, principal and interest, as shown in the Schedule "A" hereto annexed.

(6) This By-law shall take effect on the 6th day of January A. D. 1904.

(7) The votes of the Electors of the said Town of Durham shall be taken on this By-law at the following times and places, that is to say, on Monday the 4th day of January next, commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and continuing till five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, by the following deputy-returning officers:—
North Ward at Norman Kelsey's house by C. E. Vigne, J. R. O.
East Ward at Town Hall by J. Burnet, D. R. O.
West Ward, S. P. Saunders' shop by John Smith, D. R. O.

(8) On Saturday, the 2nd day of January, 1904, the Mayor of the said Town of Durham shall attend at the Council Chamber at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to sign persons to attend at the various polling places aforesaid and at the final summing-up of the votes by the Clerk on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passing of this By-law respectively.

(9) The Clerk of the Council of the said Town of Durham, shall attend at his office at 12 o'clock in the forenoon of Tuesday the 5th day of January 1904 to sign the number of votes for and against the By-law.
