BYLAW NO. 457.

Of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham.

A By-law to Authorize the issue of Debentures of the Town of Durham in the County of Grey, to the amount of \$4000 for the purpose of paying off the indebtedness incurred in the building of a Bridge across the Saugeen River at Lambton Street in the Town of Durham and to repeal By-law No. 415 of the Corporation of the Town of Durham,

WHEREAS By-law No. 415 of the Corporation of the Town of Durham best obtainable because there Debentures of the Town of Durham to the amount of \$2500.00 for the purpose of building a bridg across the Saugeen River at Lambton Street in the Town of Durham, and it has been found that the said sum of \$2500.00 is madequate for the said purpose, and it is deemed ac-visable to repeal the said By-law No. 415. AND WHEREAS the said bridge

has been constructed and the cost of construction thereof is the sum of \$4000.00 or thereabout. AND WHEREAS in order to pay off the indebtedness incurred in the con-

struction of the said bridge it will be necessary to issue Debentures of the said Town of Durham, for the sum of is the amount of the debt intended to be | therein fixed. created by this By-law) the proceeds of the said Debentures to be applied for the said purpose and no other.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to Mckecenie.-On Sunday, Dec. 13, 10 issue the said Debentures at one time ods would perhaps save you and to make the principal of the said debt repeyable by yearly sums, during the period of twenty years, being the currency of the said Debentures; said yearly sums being of such respective amounts, that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest in respect of the said debt shall be, as mearly as possible, equal to the amount so payable in each of the other nineteen years of said period, as shown in Schedule " A " hereto annexed).

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest as hereinafter provided is \$307 50.

CAPITAL, Paid up 1,000,000 RESERVE FUND 850,000 Durham enacts as follows :-(1) That By-law No. 415 of the Corporation of the Town of Lurham, be, and the same is hereby AGENTS in all principal points in

Ontario, Quebec, Manitoba, United repealed. (2) That the sum of \$4000.08-shall be expended by the Town of Durham, in liquidation of the debt incurred in building a bridge across the Saugeen River, where the said River intersects Lambton Street in the Town of Durham; and for the purpose of raising the said sum. Debentures of the said Town to the amount of \$1000.00 as aforesaid in sums of not less than \$100.00 each, shall be issued on the 6th day of January A. D. 1904, each of which Debentures shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof and shall be payable within twenty years thereafter, (namely on the 6th day of January 1921) at the Standard Bank of Canada in the said Town

(3) Each of the said Debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Town of Durham, and by the Treasurer thereof, and the Clerk of the said Town of Durham shall attach thereto the Corporate scal of the Municipality.

(4) The said Debentures shall bear interest at the rate of four and one half perceptum per annum, payable yearly at the said Bank, on the 6th day of lanuary in each and every year during the currency thereof and shall have attached to them coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer of the said Town of Durham.

(5) During the currency of the said Deben-tures, there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said Town of Durham, the sum of \$107.50 for the purpose of pay ing the amount due in each of the said years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt. (as shewn in the Schedule "A" hereto annexed.) (6) This By-law shall take effect on the 6th day of January Λ. D. 1904.
