BY-LAW NO. 457.

Of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham.

A By-law to Authorize the issue of Debentures of the Town of Durham in the County of Grey, to the amount of \$4000 for the purpose of paying off the indebtedness incurred in the building of a bridge across the Saugeen River at Lambton Street in the Town of Durham.

WHEREAS By-law No. 415 of the Corporation of the Town of Durham was enacted to provide for the issue of Debentures of the Town of Durham to the amount of \$2500.00 for the purpose of building a bridge across the Saugeen River at Lambton Street in the Town of Durham.

AND WHEREAS in order to pay off the indebtedness incurred in the construction of the said bridge it will be necessary to issue Debentures of the said Town of Durham for the sum of \$4000.00 as hereinafter provided.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said Debentures at one time and to make the principal of the said debt repayable by yearly sums.

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest as hereinafter provided is \$907.50.

WHEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham enacts as follows:

(1) That By-law No. 415 of the Corporation of the Town of Durham, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

(2) That the sum of \$4000.00 shall be expended by the Town of Durham, in liquidation of the debt incurred in building a bridge across the Saugeen River, which said river intersects Lambton Street in the Town of Durham.

(3) Each of the said Debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Town of Durham, and by the Treasurer thereof, and the said Town of Durham shall attach thereto the Corporate seal of the Municipality.

(4) The said Debentures shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per centum per annum, payable yearly at the said Bank, on the 6th day of January in each and every year during the term of years therein and shall have attached to them coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer of the said Town of Durham.

(5) During the currency of the said Debentures, there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said Town of Durham, the sum of \$907.50 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the said years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt, as shown in the Schedule "A" hereto annexed.

(6) This By-law shall take effect on the 6th day of January A. D. 1904.

(7) The votes of the Electors of the said Town of Durham shall be taken on this By-law at the following times and places, that is to say: on Monday the 4th day of January next, commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and continuing till five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, by the following deputy-returning officers:
