Arrowsmith, conveying J. Roland to Owen Sound, \$8.20; J. S. Black & J. Roland, \$6; J. N. Cholier & J. Rowland \$1.50; Mary Mullen keep of Mrs. Dillon, 4 weeks, \$8; Mrs. J. Leblanc keep of Mrs. Dillon 6 weeks, \$6.00; the clerk on salary, \$35; S. Wright work on roads, \$7.00; D. J. McNab work on bridge, \$1.00; John A. Graham wanted upon Council asking the privilege of taking water across road on lot 2, con 12; W. H. Wright, solicitor for the Eugenia Electric Power Co., asked the Council to appoint a committee to confer with the company in regard to closing part of Alma street, Eugenia.
