Conneil met on Tuesday, June 7, at 2 p. m., with all the members present except

Mr McArthur, chairman of the Educate n Committee, as delegate to the Trustees Convention, pre-ented the following re-

" In accordance with your request I attended the Trustees Fiucation Association at Toronto in May. This being my fir-t visit I cannot give an elaborate report, but wish to submit the following: (1) In view of the severe winters which prevail in this country and the consequent inability of many of the younger children to attend school during the winter months, I would ask this conneil to memorialize the minister of Education to introduce legislation to alter the school vacations so that in rural districts the summer vacation would be shortened and the winter and spring vacations lengthened; or if that be not possible, that rural trustees be given authority to alter the vacations or a part there f so as to suit sections or districts inffected by severe climatic conditions (2) I would also recommend the organization of rural school trustees into a county association to meet at the same time and place as the Teachers' County Association, and that the said trustees organisation be entitled to send one or more delegates to the Ontario Education As-ociation,"

This report was considered in committee with Mr Doyle in the chair, and afterwards adopted. Mr McArthur's expenses amounting to \$14.15 were ordered to be paid.

On motion Me-srs Gordon and Garvie. the Road and Bridge Committee is instructed to take into consideration and introduce a by-law at this session of conneil protecting county bridges at or near mill pends, so that such bridges shall not be used as a convenience for other than road purposes, and further to provide adequate means for preventing mill rubbish accumulaling on the said bridges.
