County Council.

Council met on Tuesday, June 7, at 2 p. m., with all the members present except Mr. Brown.

Mr. Arthur, chairman of the Education Committee, as delegate to the Trustees Convention, presented the following report:

In accordance with your request I attended the Trustees Education Association at Toronto in May. This being my first visit I cannot give an elaborate report, but wish to submit the following: (1) In view of the severe winters which prevail in this country and the consequent inability of many of the younger children to attend school during the winter months, I would ask this council to memorialize the minister of Education to introduce legislation to alter the school vacations so that in rural districts the summer vacation would be shortened and the winter and spring vacations lengthened; or if that be not possible, that rural trustees be given authority to alter the vacations or districts affected by severe climatic conditions. (2) I would also recommend the organization of rural school trustees into a county association to meet at the same time and place as the Teachers' County Association, and that the said trustees organization be entitled to send one or more delegates to the Ontario Education Association.

This report was considered in committee with Mr. Doyle in the chair, and afterwards adopted. Mr. Arthur's expenses amounting to \$14.15 were ordered to be paid.

On motion Messrs Gordon and Garvie, the Road and Bridge Committee is instructed to take into consideration and introduce a by-law at this session of council protecting county bridges at or near mill ponds, so that such bridges shall not be used as a convenience for other than road purposes, and further to provide adequate means for preventing mill rubbish accumulating on the said bridges.

Wednesday Morning.
 It was about 10.45 when the council assembled, a meeting of the Education committee having been prolonged discussing the account of Mount Forest High School for maintenance until after the hour of meeting. The members were all present except Mr. Gordon.

The clerk read reports from the public school inspectors of West, South and East Grey, that of Mr. Burgess being very exhaustive and giving statistics of the school attendance in all the municipalities, together with number of teachers, male and female, salaries etc. The reports of Inspector Campbell and Grier stated that owing to the severe winter fall inspections had been delayed and were not yet completed.

Rufus Oliver applied for a peddler's license and Edward Fitzgerald applied for a similar license free of charge.

Accounts were presented from Commissioners G. A. Brown, A. Garvie, J. Pringle, N. Coleman, J. M. Thomson and C. McKinnon, for work done in the divisions.
 Mr. Thomson presented report of Finance committee recommending the usual grants to the Farmers' Institutes; that the 81st Regiment be granted the sum of \$500; that the Central Agricultural Society at Walters Falls be granted \$50; the Children's Aid Society be granted \$100; that the Women's Institutes of North, South and Centre Grey be granted \$10 each on issuing their annual reports and that Harry Laporte be granted a free peddler's license.

In committee on this report with Mr. Arthur in the chair, Mr. Allen opposed the grant to the Central Agricultural Society. His motion to strike out the clause was lost on a division of 5 to 10. The report was adopted on the same division.

Mr. Shute presented report of Road and Bridge Committee recommending payment of a number of accounts and was adopted without discussion.

Mr. Arthur presented report of Education committee.

Mr. Allen presented report of judicial audit which was adopted.

Mr. Gordon presented report of standing committee of the house of refuge, recommending payment of accounts for supplies and equipment of the institution, and the same was adopted.

Wednesday Evening.
 Mr. Gordon presented a report from the architect of the house of refuge, J. S. Russel, and himself as inspector. This report recommended that certain sums be deducted from the contract price of the building for several items which were not satisfactory. In connection with the drainage, the weepers had been filled in with earth instead of gravel, or broken stone, and the consequence was that water did not pass away freely but ran through a wall and lay on the basement floor. \$120 should be deducted to remedy this. \$2 was required for a door on which the veneering was split, \$5 for painting the floors, \$30 for gazing, \$5 for pointing back wall, \$18 for a cess pit—a total of \$265 to be deducted from the contract price. It was recommended that the work be taken off the contractor's hands as satisfactory with these exceptions, allowing the contractor also for additional work amounting to \$164.50, leaving a total of \$95.50 as the amount to be deducted. The report was adopted.

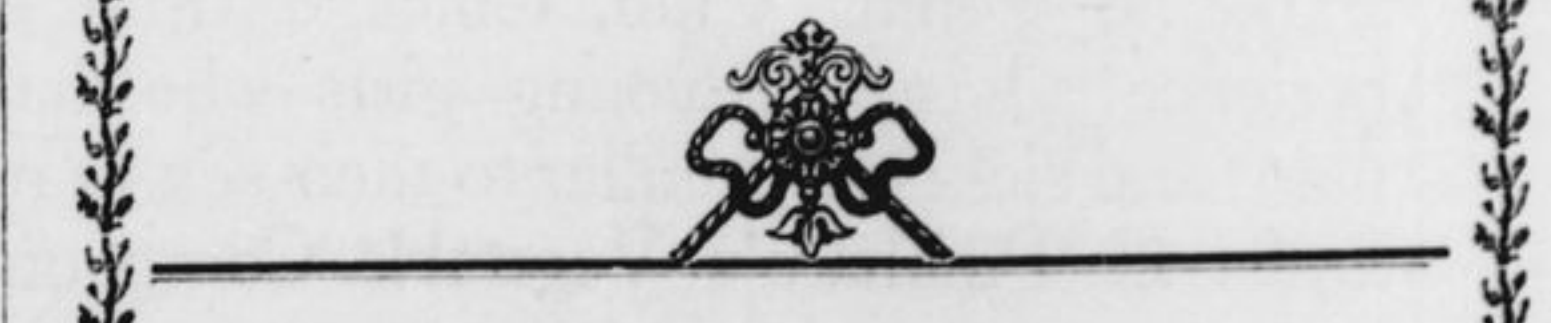
