Egrement Council.

Council met Sept 15th. Minutes of last meeting, and of special meeting, approved. A Petition from the contractor of the House of Refuge asking to be indemnified for loss sustained in said contract.

Robb—McArthur—That we take no action in the matter.—Carried.
Application was made to the Council to have Duncan MacLachlan placed in the House of Refuge. Jas Allan, Com'r., was appointed to take said party there and be paid \$5 for his services.—Carried.

Robb—Gordon—That the clerk is instructed to enter on Collectors' Roll the names of Jane McLean and Nelson Williamson with their lands, and Mrs Amos be exempt from land tax.—Carried.

By Laws 177 to levy the rates and appoint Collectors, and 178 to enable the Treasurer to borrow money until rates were collected, were passed. W Lawrence is collector for N. D., salary \$85, and D Hunter for S. D., salary \$80.

Clerk was instructed to write to Ayton and see if tile could be got for 2 or 3 culverts.

McArthur—Ferguson—That this Council instruct Com'r in Holstein to open the way for escape of the wa or lodged in front of Chas Drum's place, at once.—Carried.

A resolution was passed asking that the County Council would submit to the Electors, at the proper time, the matter of having the Reeves of the various municipalities compose the County Council.—Agreed.

Reports—The reeve and com'r Ferguson reported on sideroad Lots 5-6, Con 17. Found 52 rds north of river which would require say \$1.25 per rod to improve. Bridge say \$150.00, an expenditure of say \$20 to foot of hill, scuth, and additional on hill say \$75, would make it passable for light travel.

Gordon—Robb—That report be received and Commissioner's get \$1.00 each, fees, and this Council will supplement by an equal amount any gratis labor performed on 5th sideroad up to \$50. Said labor must be performed under Com'r Ferguson.—Carried.

Com'r McArthur reported: Thos Kirby several jobs around Orchardville amounting to \$17.50; Egrement's share \$8.75; Thos Watson, railing hill, Lot 27, Con 14, \$45.00; Graveling by days labor amounting to \$19.00; other jobs in division amounting to \$12.50.

Gordon—Ferguson—That foregoing report be adopted, and Com'r receive \$6 com. fees.—Carried.

The reeve reported that he had attended three meetings under The Ditches and Watercourses Act: At Lot 4, Con 4, instituted by reeve of Arthur To; no agreement was arrived at; Engineer of Arthur will settle. At Lot 7, Con 14, instituted by W Reid: no agreement was arrived at; Tp Engineer will settle. At Gore A, Con 5, instituted by J W Cragg; an agreement was effected which is filed with the Clerk; Township's expenses for preparing this agreement 50 cts.

McArthur—Ferguson—That the reeve's report be adopted and he receive \$6 for his services.—Carried.

Com'r Gordon reported: P McIntyre, several jobs amounting to \$9.35; Jas Lane, tamarack covering 1400 ft., \$25.20; Jno Hunt, ditching and securing Walker's bridges, \$17.65; J E Roland, culvert \$5; Arthur's share \$2.50.

Ferguson—McArthur—That foregoing report be adopted and Com'r receive \$8 com. fees.—Carried.

Com'r Ferguson reported several jobs amounting to \$69.50; out of said sum Glenelg pays \$8.50; labor done by day's work at Gore A, Con 21, amounting to \$26.50; J Long, graveling 38 rds, Lot 10, Con 20, \$18.62.

Robb—Gordon—That foregoing report be adopted and Com'r receive \$10 com. fees.—Carried.

Com'r Robb reported: Thos Yake several jobs amounting to \$78.60; D Hunter, new bridge 10th sideroad, 14 ft span, \$36.00; Graveling by day's labor, \$25.25 and several other jobs and teams on grader, \$77.45.

Gordon—McArthur—That foregoing report be adopted and Com'r receive \$11.50 com. fees.—Carried.

Com'r Hastie reported several jobs in his division amounting to \$108.78 including teams on grader; Wm Weir, operating grader and repairs, \$21.55.

McArthur—Ferguson—That reeve's report be adopted, and he receive \$7.00 com. fees.—Carried.

Gravel accounts amounting to \$90.70 were paid. Confed. printing Voters' Lists and Adv't, \$38.10; clerks registration of Voters' Lists, \$2.27; clerk telephoning 15 cts; Review, printing, \$3.50; A Mitchell, express charges, 75 cts; Com'r, Holstein, labor \$5; G Klempp, plank, Holstein sidewalks, \$43.20; clerk's marker salary, \$38.76; Reeve, cost of Agreement, Cragg vs. Sitzer, 50 cts; comr Gordon, committee work, \$2; J Calder, filling hole, \$1.00; J D Roberts, use of Hall, \$2.
