PROVINCIAL LIBERAL CONVENTION

A GREAT CONVENTION.

Wednesday of next week, a great Provincial Liberal Convention will be held in Toronto, on lines similar to that of 1883, called by Oliver Mowat. For some time back Provincial politics have been well to the front, and only the absorbing Dominion contest obscured the provincial issues. The greater out of the way, the lesser looms up again and in a somewhat startling way.

Hon Mr Davis some time ago announced his intention of retiring from the Ministry at the close of this parliament, Hon Mr Stratton has taken a similar attitude, and rightly or wrongly there is a "fama" in the country almost demanding their retirement.

The services of both have indisputably been of value to their country, and no flaw can be found in their administrative record, but the crookedness and corruption which have also indisputably been rampant at election times has been persistently laid at their door by their enemies, in spite of the findings of the courts and of the judiciary.

That the Ross government has done so much of recent years of real progressive work, is matter of surprise, considering the narrow majority they have had and the persistent and malignant "plan of campaign" of their opponents. That they could do still more is a confident certainty if they had a reasonable working majority, and it is this confidence we believe that has led Hon. G. W. Ross to call a Convention to ascertain the views of the party, to enunciate new and progressive steps in provincial progress, and to give the lie to so much of the public clamour that is the chief stock in trade of the opposition.

There is another cry, that they had been 32 years in power and should give way to their opponents. If these opponents had developed a leader, they would have won ere now, for the cry of "time for a change" is always powerful. But no one can suppose that intelligent Ontario would crush down Ross to elevate Whitney and his lieutenant Gamey. Mr Ross has had hard luck as we said last week, and the feeling of very many is that he should be given a new lease of power, with a reconstructed cabinet and this we believe will be one finding of the Convention, and later the finding of the country.

The Convention will we hope speak its mind; will condemn every corrupt method in man or minister; will be found unwavering in its support of British fair play in elections. It should be made perfectly clear for one thing that men of the Cap Sullivan or Gamey stamp should have neither part nor lot in Liberal councils.
