The largest bear ever seen or killed In the Alleghanies within the recollection of veteran hunters was bagged on Sunday morning by Ernest Barkley, a young Nimrod of 20 years and a cripple, having but one hand.

The killing of the monster occurred in what is known as the Mullenax Woods, some seven miles west of Crabbottom, on the eastern slope of the Alleghanies, and so long had this particular bruin been the quest of the mountaineer, that he had acquired a personality, and, while he was a coveted prize, the conclusion had been reached that he possessed a charmed life, and this opinion had been expressed around many a campfire during the last quarter of a century.

The weight of the bear, after the entrails were removed, was 789 pounds. Across the ball of his foot he measured eight inches and between the ears nine inches.
