COST OF LONDON FOGS.

Three years ago one such fog black in London, stretched from Land's End to Yorkshire, from Ireland to Germany. Naturally, it is the amount of coal refuse in the air above London that makes the fog there often of so rich a quality. Here may be gleaned some idea of how vast that quantity of smuts and sooty atoms it. An ordinary dwelling house having, say, two fires going, spreads a tremendous quantity of smoky air around it daily-namely, 8/2 tons. Factory chimneys are supposed to be grave offenders in contaminating the air. But the total number of tons of smoky air poured out daily from the factories makes a comparatively poor show when contrasted with the 5,500,000-ton cloud of smoky air that is created by the Londoner's domestic fireplace How many foggy days does London have in a year? The total, of course, varies great-

iv, and in latter years has been usually less than the average. Some experts have ascribed this effect to the increased popularity of gas stoves making no smoke. Others declare t to be simply accident, and promise that it will make up for it later on. Twenty years ago or so. London's average was twenty fogs a year, in the hard winter of 1879-80 there were 43 foggy days, but 1830-91 had the record of 59 days of fog. Since then, fogs , which kill off thousands of peo ple each winter, happily less prevalent. One of the longest lasting fogs of which record has been kept occurred in December, 1873. With slight intervals of mere mistiness, 1 lasted from the beginning of the secon week of that month until Christmas Eve. All the particles of sooty matter that London's chimneys send up into the air become, in a fog, saturated with moisture, and descended upon London again. London fogs are always productive of incidents. Pickpockets then invariably reap a god haul. A winter or two back some cattle being driven to market were lost i a London fog, and some of them were not found until next morning. In nearly every
