The Council of Gleneleg newly elected on January 26th are: Messrs. J. S. Black, Chairman, Wm. Weir, Edwin W. Hunt, Geo. E. Arrowsmith and John A. McMillan, Esq's., Councillors. Each member made and subscribed the necessary declarations of qualification and office, and took their seats, the reverend the chair. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed. Com- munitations read as follows: From the clerk, statement of votes polled and the expenses of election; from Geo. Kelly, statement of Gleneleg's balance in Bank; from Messrs. McJirr, McLellan, Cook and Ellison, Collectors' account with Treasurer; from Thos Greenwood, gravol account; from Wm. C. Ranage, account for sundries for Hall; from C. Ranage, account for printing; from Dr. Hutton, re analysis of water from the well used by J. Bell; from J. H. McDonald and James Staple, applications for the office of assessor.

B. Laws 447, 448 & 449, re Auditor, Local Board of Health and Assessor, was introduced and read a first and second time.

Hunt—Arrowsmith—That the Clerk ask for application for the office of Assessor in the Durham Review and ap- plicants not to state salary required.—Car- ried.

McMillan—Hunt—That Bylaw No. 447 as filed up with the names of R. T. El- ward and John McJones, and Bylaw No. 448 as filed up with the names of R. J. Terry and Dr. Hutton, be now read a third time and amended and engrossed on Bylaw book.—Carried.

Arrowsmith—Hunt—That Election Ex- penses amounting to \$58.59 be paid.—Car- ried.

McMillan—Weir—That C. Ranage be paid \$18.85 for printing.—Carried.

Weir—Hunt—That Collector No. 4 be instructed to return taxes charge against lot 47, of G. Con. 1, E. G. R. against the Land.—Carried.

Hunt—McMillan—That Wm. Black be paid the sum of \$14 for sundries for Hall, also T. Hill & Co. 1st cents for hinges to Hall door.—Carried.

Weir—McMillan—That Dr. Hutton's account re analysis of water from the well of John Bell amounting to \$4.35, being half cost of same be paid.—Carried.

McMillan—Arrowsmith—That seven copies of the Municipal Report be procured for use of Council.—Carried.

McMillan—Hunt—That the reverend and Wm. Weir be a committee to examine as to the sufficiency of the Treasurers' au- ditors, and report at next meeting of council.—Carried.

Weir—McMillan—That Thos. Green- wood be paid 75 cents for gravel for roads.—Carried.

McMillan—Weir—That Thos. Davis' name be inserted in Bylaw 446 as arbitra- tor instead of E. W. Hunt.—Carried.

Arrowsmith—McMillan—That the clerk be instructed to write to the Local papers namely: Markdale Standard, Durham Re- view and Chronicle, and get their prices for Tp Printing for the year 1905.—Car- ried.

Arrowsmith—Weir—That the clerk be paid \$1.50 for repair of Hall door, also Dan Campbell \$9.45 for 24 cords of dry wood delivered at Hall.—Carried.

McMillan—Arrowsmith—That the rever- end be paid \$2 for preparing Financial State- ment and \$2 for committee re Geo. Roy.—Carried.

Wards were divided as follows: Ward 1. W. Weir, Ward 2. J. A. McMillan, Ward 3. Geo. E. Arrowsmith, Ward 4. E. W. Hunt and the Reeve to supervise the whole Township.

The Council adjourned to Feb. 4, at 10 a. m.

**Horrors in St Petersburg.**

Saturday and Sunday last a fearful catastrophe took place in the Russian capital. An extensive strike had been in progress for some days, and this seems to have furnished a nucleus for the beginning of a rising of the masses of the people which may amount to a revolution comparable to that of France over 100 years ago.

Led by a priest named Gohon, work- men, with wives and children, desper- ate from baffled efforts to treat with their employers, marched to lay their complaints before the Czar. The authorities looked on the movement as insurrectionary, and called in the mil- itary, and it appears with brutal calmness, waited till the crowd got dense and fired into their midst, kill- ing hundreds and wounding hundreds more.

What is to be the outcome it is hard to say. Moscow workmen are striking in sympathy, and other places are showing sympathy, and if the army should turn with the masses the throne of the Czars might fall.

What a fearful situation! Her navy destroyed, her greatest fortress cap- tured, a vast army at bay and likely to be defeated, and at the centre of authority a rebellion in progress. At Britain's darkest hour in South Africa, her children flocked to her aid; in Russia how different. May the tyranny of a 4th depression so long, rampant speedily be destroyed.
