## By-law No. 490

of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham.

5—During the currency of the said debentures, there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said Town of Durham, the sum of \$1263 74 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the said years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt (as shewn in the Schedule "A" hereto annexed).

6—This Bylaw shall take effect on the day of the final passing thereof by the Municipal Council of the Town of Durham.

7—The votes of the electors of the said Town of Durham, entitled to vote, shall be taken on this Bylaw at the following times and places, that is to say:—On Friday the 21st day of April next, commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon, and continuing till five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day by the following deputy returning officers.

8—On Thursday, the 20th day of April next, the Mayor of the said Town of Durham, shall attend at the office of the Clerk of the said Town of Durham, to appoint persons to attend at the various polling places, aforesaid and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passing of this Bylaw respectively.

9—The Clerk of the Council of the said Town of Durham, shall attend at his office in the Town of Durham, at ten o'clock in the forenoon of Saturday the 22nd day of April A D 1905 to sum up the number of votes for and against this Bylaw.

## GETTING OUT OF THE RANKS

We announced last week that Mr Jno Graham, teacher at present in No 9, Glenelg, had resigned his school to take a commercial position in the office of the N. P. Cement Co. here. Mr. Graham has been at the blackboard for about 20 years and has been remarkably successful and the loss of his experience and ability, natural and acquired, to the teaching profession calls for more than passing comment.

Mr. Graham has passed nearly 100 pupils through the Entrance, Public School Leaving and Third class examinations, and some of his earlier pupils now hold important and responsible positions. In the twenty years he has had no break through ill health or otherwise and never could he be accused of "Undermining" for he raised the salary of every school he accepted, the future rewards of the profession have not been altering enough to retain even him with such a record of success.

Twenty years ago the proportion of the sexes attending the Normal Schools was nearly equal; in 1904 at Toronto Normal School, there were 13 men and over 100 women, with the prospect of likely to go on as long as the rewards in industrial pursuits are so much more generous than in the teaching profession.

Twice of late Durham School Board has lost two excellent teachers owing to this cause and Mr. Graham's is the latest instance.

Some strange things come to light in horse trading, but the following is a case where a man sold a horse for \$75 and by trading got him back for \$8. Judge Colter held Division Court at Rodney Lusty vs. Lamont, was tried before a jury. The defendant sold plaintiff a horse for \$75, then purchased another horse for \$15; he then traded this one with plaintiff for his old horse, receiving \$9 to boot, so that he got \$75 in cash and his horse back for \$8. The case occupied all day, and at 11 p. m. the jury returned a verdict that it was just a horse trade and plaintiff must abide by what he had done.—Grand Valley Star


