not a man who is generally known. How Sculptors Work in Marble. The artist makes a model first, not always life size, but almost none of them actually do the cutting in the marble. This work is intrusted to highly skilled artisans, who do the work under their directions, and the sculptors superintend all the finishing touches and even occasionally do some of the cutting on the face and hands. The actual cutting of the stone is a most difficult process and requires great expert skill. In case a full sized model is made the sculptor sends it to a professional marble cutter, Cure The Lung who roughly shapes the block. The general shape is often given to the block before it leaves the marble yard, to save the extra freight. The rough carving is then done by the marble cutter, who se shapes the block as to give it the general outline of the figure to be reproduced. He drills a series of holes in the block, the depth of each of which corresponds to an external point of the statue supposed to be enclosed in the stone. After a sufficient number of these holes have been made in the stone he removes the entire perforated portion, and what remains gives the broad lines of the
