# Draining and Spring Tillage.

Some Important Hints.

(1) Now is the time to observe the nee of drianing. The existence of pools and wet nad dry patches and the general direction of the water courses should be observed in order to learn whether drainage is necessary and in what directions drains should be laid. The drainage of farm lands should be regarded as an investment.
