Draining and Spring Tillage. Some Important Hints.

(1) Now is the time to observe the need of draining. The existence of pools and wet mud dry patches and the general direction of the water courses should be observed in order to learn whether drainage is necessary and in what directions drains should be laid.

(2) Also, now is the time to observe the benefits of fall plowing. The difference should be noted between land, especially sloping land, that has been left smooth and firm over the winter, and land that was plowed in the fall and left rough and loose.

(3) Shallow tillage should begin on land as early as possible to prevent hardening and to conserve the moisture in the sub-soil. After the seeding is done, land for roots and corn or other later crops should be cultivated at once to prevent the escape of moisture and to insure a good seed bed.

(4) It is a good plan sometimes in preparing land for seeding to harrow before cultivating. This will mellow the surface and will form a better seed bed than if the cultivator is used first. If plowing is to be done, it should be done as early as possible, and as shallow as is consistent with its purpose.

(5) The roller should be used with care and judgment; otherwise the layer will be wasted, or worse still, harm will be done. If the seed bed is lumpy, most after a shower when they have been softened by the moisture.

(6) If rains have occurred after seeding, or if it has not been possible to loosen the surface soil after rolling, before the crop shows through the ground, then the harrow may be used with advantage after the crop has started.

News of the death of James Hatch reached us yesterday by way of the South Bend, Ind., Tribune. Mr Hatch resided for a long time in Holstein and left there about a year ago for South Bend to live with his son. He would have attained his 90th birthday next month. His two brothers and two sisters lived to be over 90 years of age and when they were all alive their combined ages totalled over 400 years. The deceased's eldest son Henry, of Binghampton, N. Y., is 74 years old; the next, Joseph, of Ferguson, is 72 years; Thos and Wm of Dryden, are 70 and 68 respectively; the youngest is a daughter, Mrs Anderson, of South Bend, aged 47.

Eugenia Will Be Developed.

Mr. O'Donoghue, and Mr R J McLaughlin of the law firm of McLaughlin & Johnston, Toronto, met the Artesia Council to discuss the question of electrical development at Eugenia and to arrange definite terms by which the Georgian Bay Power Company could acquire the township's interest in the waterpower. After a lengthy discussion a definite arrangement was arrived at. The agreement was in substance as follows:—

1—The company to supply light and power at Eugenia and at present distributing points, also at other points within the municipality when a guarantee of \$500 revenue was given, at a rate 10 per cent less than the figure set outside points.
