### THE VOTE ON THE SECOND READING.

The important vote on the 2nd reading of the Autonomy bill took place last week, and the government was sustained by a majority of 281. Thirteen Conservative members voted with the government the vote standing 140 to 59 or nearly 2 1/2 to one.

Ontario and Prince Edward Island were the only provinces giving a majority against the bill, standing 34 to 44 and 1 to 2 respectively. Quebec stood 60 to 1 in favor, the sole objector being Dr Walsh of Huntingdon, New Brunswick. Territories 7 to 3, British Columbia 7 to 0, Yukon 1 to 0.

Had every seat been filled and members been 80 without the speaker, the Globe estimates of the 13 Conservatives were from Quebec, one of these being H. B. Ames, a member of the Protestant Council of Public Instruction from Ontario, Pringle of Cornwall and Lewis, West Huron, and the Yukon member.

It is surprising to find the Territories in its favor by 7 to 3 and Manitoba by 6 to 3, and this will go far to carry out the claim that only Ontario is exciting itself about it.

The bill will now go through committee and likely pass at its third reading by practically the same vote.

### Hon. Jas. Sutherland Dead.

After broken health for two years and serious illness for many months the above gentleman, Minister of Public Works in the Dominion Cabinet, passed away last Wednesday at the age of 66. The Premier in announcing his death was overcome by emotion, which Mr. Borden said was more eloquent than his eloquent words of the loss he had sustained in his government and of what the country had suffered by his death. As a mark of respect the Premier moved and Mr Borden seconded that the House adjourn for the funeral. On all sides is testimony that Mr Sutherland was a warm friend and a generous opponent. Mr Sutherland had a unique record in never having been defeated in any of his contests.

LONDON AND SOUTH OXFORD

The death of the Hon. Jas Sutherland will cause two elections—in his own constituency of South Oxford, and in London where Mr Hyman, who has been acting Minister of Public Works, must now go back for re-election, for it is certain he will be promoted to the portfolio.

Mr Sutherland's majority was about 1500 while Mr Hyman's was only 24, so that there is a fighting chance to defeat the new minister. However this is scarcely likely for the city will hardly reject Mr Hyman with all its added dignity of Min. of Public Works.

The elections will furnish a test of the feeling of Ontario on the autonomy bills.
