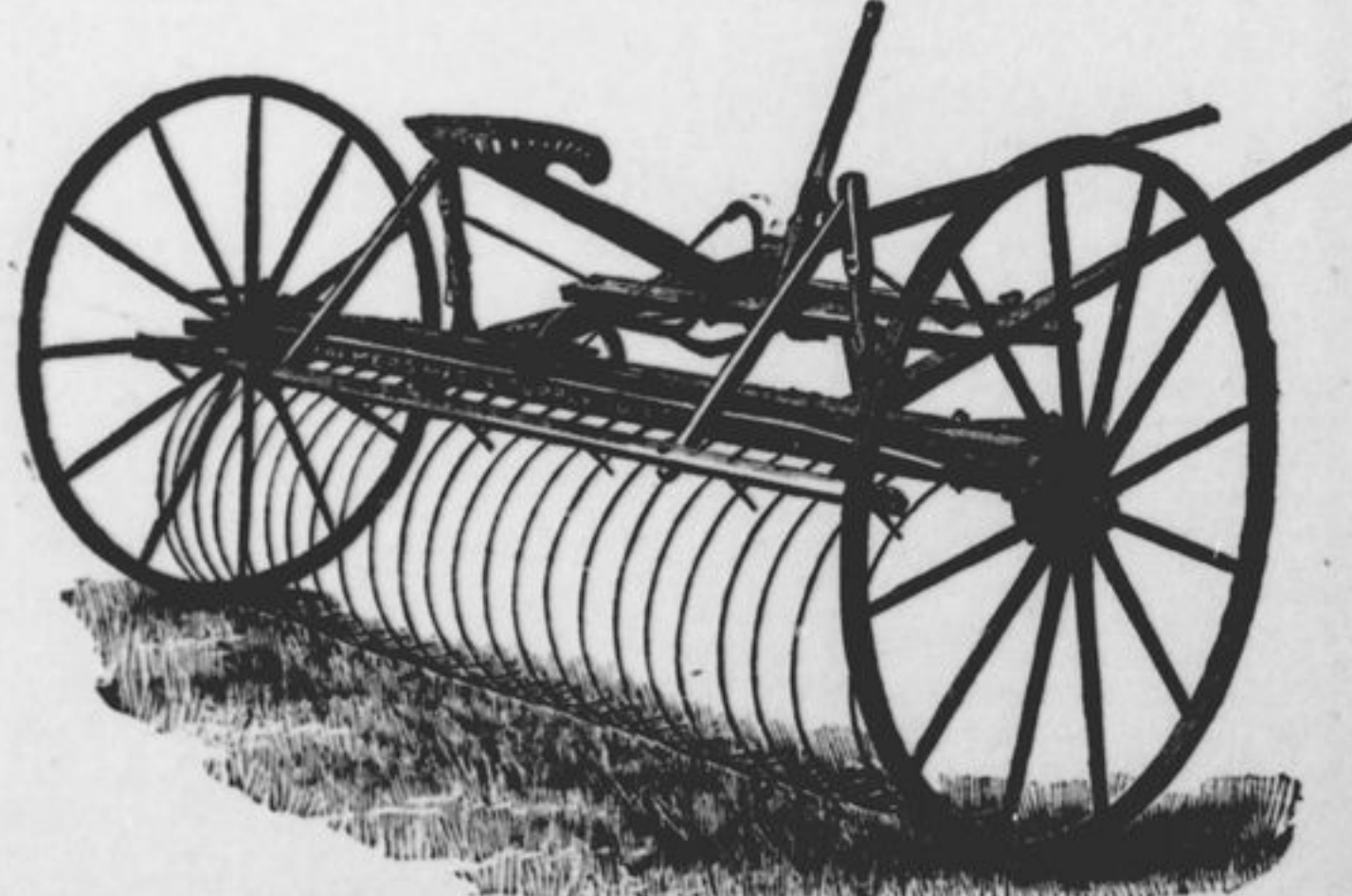

A Double Header.

The elections on Tuesday resulted in the return of both the Liberal candidates by good majorities. In North Oxford Smith is elected by nearly 300, while Hyman in London has over 300. The reduction in Sutherland's majority was expected under any circumstances, for it was well known that the late member had a personality that no successor in sight was possessed of, a personality which drew to him many from the ranks of his opponents. However, it is very likely the blood-red hue and cry of Catholic domination influenced a few, though the result in London does not bear out this idea.

Norway.

France and Germany by hereditary hatred keep in the world's eye. So does Britain and Russia for that and other reasons. Austria and Italy are not forgotten while the Sultan sees that Turkey is kept to the front by a massacre or two. Spain's tortures and misfortunes past and present are quite conspicuous, but who for a hundred years has looked for excitement in Norway!!

But it has come. Last week she broke the only link that bound her to Sweden, by repudiating King Oscar, who was King of both countries, though their parliaments were entirely separate. Sweden has monopolized the consular service of both countries it appears, and, Norway claims, to her disadvantage. Norway has the third largest mercantile marine in the world and is constantly outstripping Sweden in trade though her population is smaller.

They have offered the crown to Oscar's son but it has been refused in the meantime. Would the King of Denmark's son take it? No, thank you. So the upshot may be that Norway may become a republic.

If left alone they will likely settle the matter peacefully, but there is fear of Russian and German interference which might cause a new storm in Europe.
