The Seizure of Sakhalin.



By capturing the Island of Sakhalin Japan destroys the last of the specious arguments advanced by Russian casualists who oppose the payment of an indemnity. For Sakhalin, or rather was, Russian territory, not as Port Arthur and the Liaoning Peninsula were by lease or as Manchuria was by virtue of military occupation, but in fee simple, the title being guaranteed by treaty and unquestionable under international law. Until some time early in the 17th century, Sakhalin, which is a long narrow island fronting the maritime portion of Manchuria while China ceded to Russia more than fifty years ago, was under the dominion of China. When Chinese authority passed the Japanese established colonies on the Southern end of Sakhalin, which they continued to occupy until 1875. In that year Russia, whose commercial and military agents had founded settlements and built small fortifications in the northern portion offered Japan some of the islands in the Kurile group in exchange for the lower end of Sakhalin. The records do not show whether Japan made the exchange voluntarily or otherwise, but made it was and the latter thirty years Sakhalin from Cape Elizabeth to the Strait of La Perouse has been a Russian possession. At any time within the last year Japan could have taken Sakhalin. It was lightly garrisoned, most of the defenders being convicts compelled to do military duty during their term of detention. The very helplessness of the colony undoubtedly induced the Japanese to postpone their attack upon it until the weightier problems presented by the Manchurian campaign, by the siege of Port Arthur and lastly by the arrival of the Baltic fleet in Eastern waters, had been finally solved. The purpose of the Russian Government to offer the cession of Sakhalin as an equivalent for an indemnity was long ago suspected by Japan. That purpose if it has existed at all, has now been most effectively discounted and Japan is in possession of a cogent argument which she can employ by her plenipotentiaries in their efforts to secure a peace agreement in all respects satisfactory to the Mikado. Commercially, Sakhalin is of small account, but politically it counts for a great deal when thrown into the scale along with Port Arthur, Dalny and the southern half of Manchuria.—Brooklyn Eagle.

It was a sad sight to see so many boys and girls weeping and taking a last long lingering look of all that remained of her who was so dear to them in life. Strong men and women wept at the grave and many flowers and wreaths were laid by loving hands on her casket, which was a beautiful white velvet one also a pillow of roses from the Sunday School where she was a member. Kind friends went that morn and lined the grave with wadding, ferns and daisies and it did not seem to the sorrowing parents that their darling's body was being laid away in the cold rough earth, but rather in a soft fleecy white cloud so very becoming to their pure hearted flower-loving Bessie who gave her heart to the Lord some three years ago but did not feel satisfied with her experience. She always seemed to long for and want the experience of older Christians but having frequently talked with her we do not mourn as those who have no hope as her last testimony was that she was trusting fully in her Saviour. Many friends from Conn. Orchard, Bunnison and Durham were present at her funeral, the pall bearers being six boys from the S. School. Roy Aldred, Herbie Vollet, Max Allan, Wilbert Blythe, Cameron Lauder, Willie Morrison. Bright be the shroud that enfolds her Ever green be the velvety sod, Full of beauty the cloud that floats o'er her. Dear Bessie has gone to her God.—Con.
