Bentinck Council.

Met in Dorchester on Monday, Aug. 7th, 1905. Members a present, the Reeve in the chair. Minutes of Court of Revision and of session of May 27th last read and passed.

The Reeve reported having had completed and paid for new bridges on side line 18, Con. 2, N. D. R., at Woolley's Mill. Cost with approaches \$1215.25. He also reported having expended \$37.18 in repairs to old bridges.

The several Commissioners reported having expended the following amounts in the improvement of roads since last meeting, viz: \$273.90 in Road Division No. 2, \$264.80 in No. 1, \$210.40 in No. 3 and \$335.05 in No. 4 including grant to the village of Elmwood. The reports were ordered to be received and cheques issued.

A deputation of the Reeve of Normanby and County Councillor Scotchman waited on Council in reference to a deviation of the County Line between Hanover and a point south of Neustadt. The Reeve and Councillor Willis were appointed on behalf of and to attend to the interests of the Township of Bentinck in the matter.

Applications for the office of Collector were received from D. McDougall and Robert Brigham. D. McDougall was re-appointed at same salary as last year, viz: \$119. Councillor Torry was appointed to enquire into the collector's surties and report.

By-law No 7 levying the following rates was duly passed, viz: 2 1/2 mills on \$ for Township expenses and improvements, 1 1/2 mills for County rate and one and one-fourth mills for General School Rate. Also by-law No 8 levying rates in the several school sections.

Councillor Cronin was appointed to enquire into the complaint of Messrs Carter and Crawford, Townships B. & S., re overflow of water on their land.

The following accounts were ordered to be paid: Sawyer's Masses, circles for grader \$1.30, Thomas Torry, retainer for telephone and express charges 95c, Robt Ewan, witness fees in case of Clerk vs. Township \$2.00, McCracken and others, repairs to grader \$4.60.

James Walker and John Dodsworth, Pathmasters, were authorized to expend \$8 and \$4 respectively in their divisions, being for unperformed statute labour in 1904.

Mr. Torry was instructed to enquire into the agreement between the Township and Edwin Lamin concerning his slaughter house on lot 1 con. 28 W G R. Ed. Rohnd was allowed 2 days road work for use of winter road through his fields.

Council adjourned to meet at Elmwood on October 14th at 9 o'clock in the forenoon.
