Hon. W. J. Hanna, has issued new regulations respecting the regularation o marriages. There are between 18,000 and 19,000 marriages each year in the province of Outario, and from 200 to 800 of these are not register-d, while many are delayed in some cases 15 months.

Important changes for the purpose of ensuring the safe keeping of the records are announced by the Registrar General's Department of the Ontario Government. The preservation of licenses is to be taken ont of the hands of officiating ministers, and is to be handled in a more business. like way by the department itself.

After the performance of the ceremony, under the new regulations, the clergyman is directed to forward the documents in his possession to the government officials in the Queen's Park.

The following is a statement of the changes handed out by the department: 1. Under former regulations all licouses are held in possession of the officiating clergymen.
