RUSSIAN MUTINEERS ATTACK SEBASTOPOL.

The City Bombarded by Two Vessels Belonging to the Squadron That Had Revolted.

The Sailors Who Were Ashore in Barracks Assisted and Attacked the Loyal Forces.

The Forts and Loyal Ships Smashed the Attacking Force and the Mutineers Surrendered.

Sebastopol, Dec. 4.—Lieut. Schmidt, the commander of the mutineers, fixed 3 o'clock this afternoon as the time for the receipt of a favorable reply to the demand of the sailors, namely, that a Constitutional Assembly be immediately formed to accept the reforms promised in the czar's manifesto...

When the time had elapsed and no answer had been received, Lieut. Schmidt opened fire from two vessels. The South forts, part of the squadron and part of the coast artillery, which remained loyal, returned Lieutenant Schmidt's fire...

The battle lasted two hours and a half. The cruiser Otchakoff was pierced and burst into flames. The auxiliary cruiser Dnieper and another vessel, besides torpedo boats, were sunk...

The commander of the Otchakoff, Lieut. Schmidt, emphatically accepted the challenge, replying with both batteries, one trained on the town, and the other on the Fort Alexander batteries on the north shore.

According to a more detailed report received from another source, and supported by the above, and several vessels which remained loyal replied.

During the naval battle the sailors on the shore entrenched in the barracks, defended their position with machine guns and rifles against the attacking mutineers...

No details of the casualties or the damage sustained by the town are obtainable by the Admiralty, but owing to confined space in which the battle was fought, it is improbable that the town escaped without heavy damage.

The demands of the mutineers are said to have included, besides the 15 proposals dealing with service conditions, the convening of a Constitutional Assembly and the complete realization of liberties promised by the imperial manifesto.

The Workmen's Council has decreed that the general post office in St. Petersburg shall close at 3 o'clock this afternoon, when communication with the outside world may cease.

The most disquieting reports are in circulation regarding the disintegration of the Guard regiments, two of which, the workmen band, have definitely resolved not to fire on the people.
