According to the international post bureau, taking all the post-offices of the world, the United States shows the heaviest loss from the management of its postal affairs and Great Britain the largest profits. Nineteen hundred and three is the last year for which figures for comparison are available, and for that year we ran beind \$4,329,000, while Great Britain showed a net profit of \$22,000,000, and Russia, Germany and France each about \$14,000,000.
