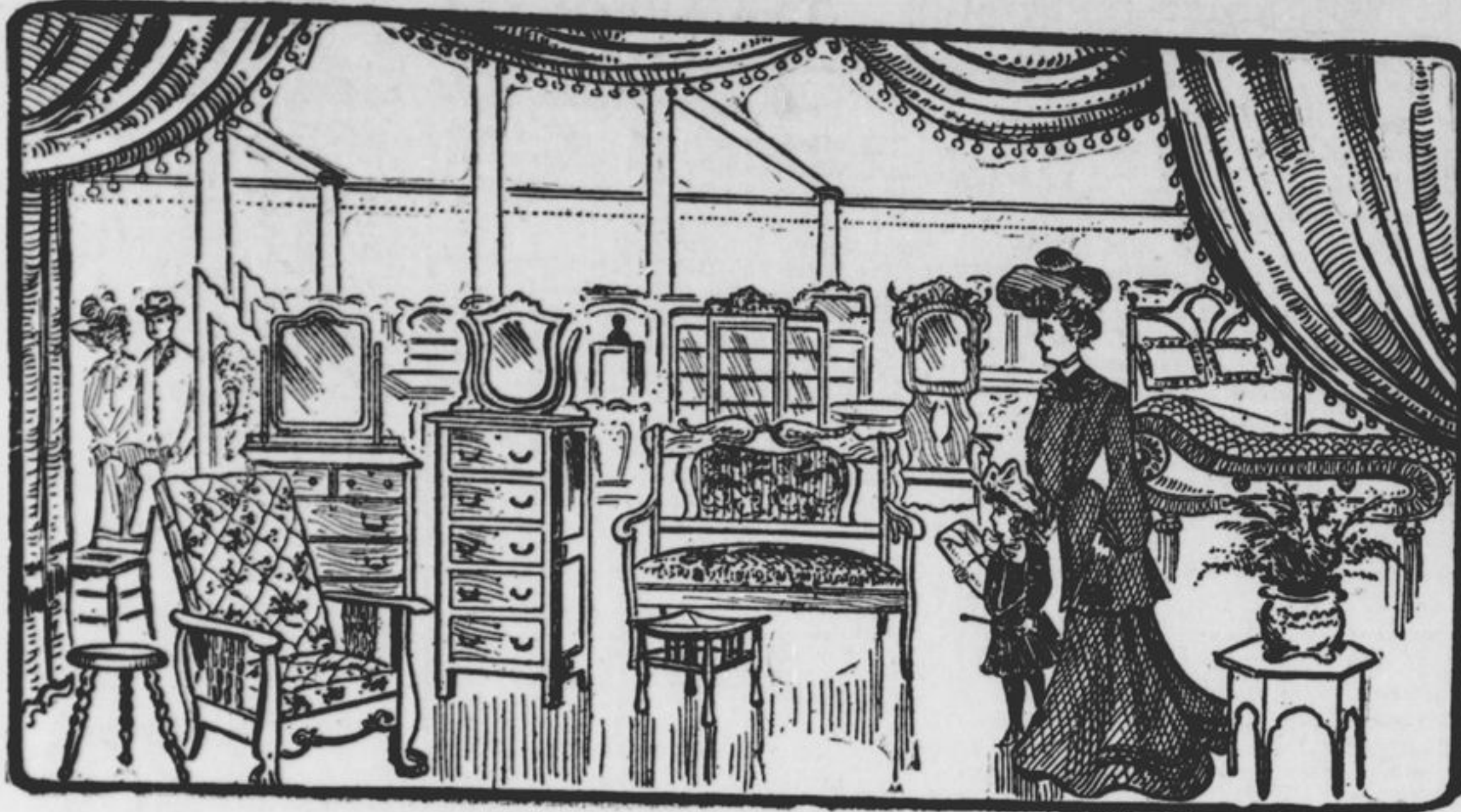

A number of the farmers took advantage of the recent snow by hauling out logs and wood, though sleighing was poor.

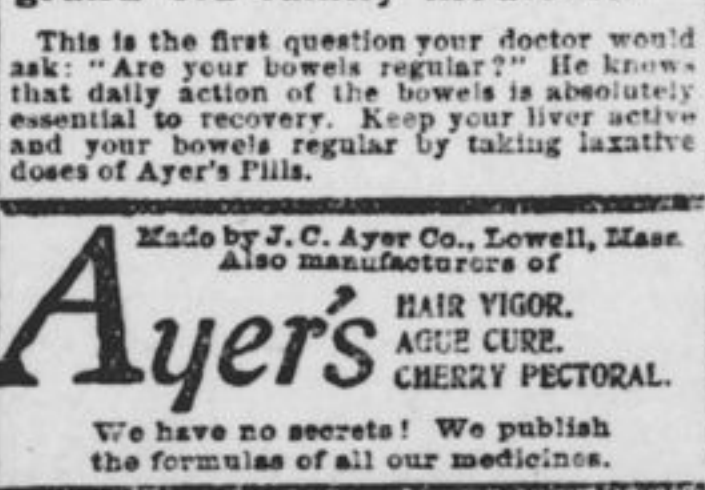
Staff Capt. McGillivray is busily engaged in stationing the emigrants coming out under General Booth.
