ADDITIONAL LOCALS.

Guelph city council is sending circulars to cities and towns within 150 miles of Niagara Falls asking them to co-operate in urging the Ontario government to establish a power plant of their own at the Falls so as to furnish power to the reachable municipalities of Ontario at a cheap rate.

An amendment to the License act is introduced into the Manitoba Legislature which confines the liquor traffic to the business part of the city. Druggists will be allowed to sell only under Dr's certificate. Pool rooms must close at same time as the bar and under the same penalty for the violation of the act. Persons under eighteen shall not be allowed to loiter therein unless accompanied by parent or guardian. Brewers' license will be raised to \$500.

Giving a Reminder.

Hon G. W. Ross gave the Legislature an opportunity to enjoy a lot of quiet humor at the expense of the Government while speaking in reply to the Lieut.-Governor's speech. With his face beaming significantly, Mr Ross pointed out that the Provincial Treasurer took to himself and the present Ministry much credit for "having a surplus of \$902,150," but the Hon. Treasurer did not tell the House that that surplus was partially made from profits arising from the Temiskaming Railway—an enterprise not very warmly welcomed by the Hon. gentleman when it was launched. This railway had brought a surplus of \$100,000. Then there was the succession duties—another product of a former Government which furnished the balance of this surplus. Mr Ross continuing said he was glad the Government had a surplus. "How did they get it?" he asked. "Has my hon. friend the Treasurer done anything to produce it?" Very little. He would have reduced the succession duties tax. But now he has a surplus, come by honestly, but by succession. (Laughter.) He is very much like
