New County Councils Act.

The new County Councils Act has been printed and distributed. Its essential features are as follows:

1. In and for the year 1907 and thereafter the council of every county or union of counties in this Province shall be constituted as follows:

1. Every town not separated from the county for municipal purposes and every township and village shall be represented in such council by the reeve of such town, township and village municipality, and in addition to the reeve, by deputy reeve or deputy Reeves as follows:

(a) If the municipality had the names of more than 1,000 and not more than 2,000 persons on the last revised voters' list of the municipality as qualified to vote at municipal elections, then by a first deputy reeve.

(b) If the municipality had more than 2,000 and not more than 3,000 such names upon such list, then by a first deputy reeve, a second deputy reeve and a third deputy reeve.

(c) If the municipality had more than 3,000 such names upon such list, then by a first deputy reeve, a second deputy reeve and a third deputy reeve.

2. The number of councillors to be elected in any township in accordance with the provisions of the Consolidated Municipal Act, 1903, shall be decreased by the number of deputy Reeves to be elected therein, but this provision shall not apply to towns or villages.

2. Such reeves and deputy Reeves shall be elected by general vote in the manner provided by the Consolidated Municipal Act, 1903, for the elections of mayors of towns and Reeves and councillors in villages and townships, and they shall be members of the council of the municipalities in which they are elected.

3. No member shall take his seat in the county council until he has filed with the clerk of the county a certificate of the clerk of the town, township or village under his hand and the seal of the municipal corporation that such member was duly elected and has made and subscribed to the declaration of office and qualification as reeve or deputy reeve of the county.

This Council met April 14th, as per adjournment, all the members present, the reeve in the chair, minutes of last meeting read and confirmed. Communications read as follows: Dr. Ego, account for attendance on a Diptheria family, Turner & Co, account for medicine for same family, from Isaac Travnor, account for surveying, from MacKay and Dunn, claim for damages to property on a supposed defective road, from Sawyer and Massey Company Invoice for road grader, from A. McLachlin and D. Sinclair, account for repair of bridge on side-road 50, from local Board of Health several accounts for services rendered, from the reeve his report on what was said to be defective road.

McMillan—Hunt That the Clerk be instructed to ask for Tenders for a capable man to operate grader, Tenders to be received by the first of May stating salary. Lowest or any tender not necessarily accepted.—Carried.

McMillan—Black That the claim for damages to Walpole's dray wagon, and the International Harvester Company's Gasoline engine be not entertained, but that the reeve and Mr. Hunt adopt proper steps to defend in case suits are entered.—Carried.

Black—Hunt That the reeve and clerk be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to assign Lot 36, Con 3, N D 1 to John A. McMillan, and cause the seal of this corporation to be attached thereto.—Carried.

McMillan—Hunt That A. McLeod be paid \$4.50 for cedar plank for repair of bridge on side-road 50, Con 2, N D R, A. McLachlin 75 cents and D. Sinclair \$1.75 for work and 80 cents for bolts and washers. Total \$7.80.—Carried.

Hunt—Weir That Isaac Travnor be paid \$14.50 for surveying deviations of Lots 26, Con 8 and 25, Con 9 and making plans thereof.—Carried.

McMillan—Hunt That the clerk be paid \$4.00 for preparing By-Laws 405 and 410 for National Portland Cement Company, the Company having paid the same to T. Treasurer.—Carried.

Hunt—McMillan That the reeve be paid \$2.00 for a trip to Bentinck to interview the reeve of Bentinck in regard to the accident on gravel road between G & B and \$1.00 for inspecting the road where the accident was said to have taken place.—Carried.

McMillan—Black That the reeve be paid \$1.00 and Mr. Weir \$1.50 for curbing and caring for the grader.—Carried.

Hunt—Black That A. F. Wyvil be paid \$3.00 for work on road on lot concession.—Carried.

Weir—Black That the Treasurer be paid \$1.80 for postage and stationery.—Carried.

Hunt—Weir That M. Black and Geo. Leitch be paid \$1.00 each for repairing bridge at Lot 20, Con 10.—Carried.

Black—McMillan That Edwin Hunt be paid \$1.00 for inspecting road at Lot 9 Con 1, E G R.—Carried.

Weir—Black That ward appropriation for the present year be \$150.00 for each Ward.—Carried.

The Council adjourned until called for Court of Revision.
